Woolley is in a formally designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and part of the Cotswold Way. This valley lies in the shadow of Solsbury Hill made famous by former resident, Peter Gabriel.

The valley was specifically protected from any environmental changes in a unique Article 4 Direction of 1992 signed by the Secretary of State.
